We began our programs by playing sports together. We expanded this passion into Health & Fitness Programs in 2012 to incorporate nutrition, counseling, and opportunities to be active on a daily basis. These programs teach essential character skills, determination, healthy habits, and teamwork.

When we play well together, we all win. Over the years our participants have grown up into strong leaders who reach their goals and give back to others.

#### **FPR SPEED**

Our team consisted of 174 athletes this season from 19 different schools in the Memorial/Spring Branch Area. Congratulations to all 21 of our Family Point State and National Champion student-athletes who competed in the 2018 National Junior Olympic Outdoor Track and Field Championship in Des Moines, Iowa. At the end of July the top 6 track and field athletes in their respective events from all 50 states competed for a chance to become an All-American. A total of 10,040 athletes competed in the 2018 National Junior Olympic Championship. Sarah Akpan, Divine Ozomma, and Shannon Robbins ranked in the top ten in the nation.

## NPC Library creates friendship & opportunities

Our library is a safe place where children can express themselves and know they are accepted. During this time together children are able to create lasting friendships and find consistent support. They learn coping and communication skills which allow them to overcome challenges and develop healthy habits and a positive self image. This is also a place where parents come to register their children in sports, volunteer, and connect with new friends. Sharing time and space allow us to grow and learn together so we can innovatively shape and positively change our community and world.

#### In 2017-2018

hosted **5** Monthly Family Potlucks raised over **\$1,100** at FPR's Christmas Store donated to recovery efforts in Puerto Rico

redistributed \$70,000 from the Greater Houston Community Foundation for rental and grocery assistance to neighbors affected by Hurricane Harvey.

**Eagle Scout & Gold Award Projects** provided us with a Theatre Camp, Art Room sink & cabinets, a community garden, and shade.

**St. Thomas & Trees for Houston** provided bushes and fruit trees.

In 2007, we rented about 500 sq ft in the Outreach Center of West Houston. After Blue Willow Bookshop's 'Build the Library Campaign,' a huge remodel in 2011, and repairs in 2017, we currently rent over 1,500 sq ft.

Over the years we have worked with neighbors and churches to develop the inside and outside space into something beautiful which offers hope and a place of belonging in our wonderfully diverse community.






