FamilyPoint Resources engages our community in supportive relationships that meet needs, build hope, and transform lives.

FamilyPoint addresses whole child development by providing enriching and accessible programs in Arts & Education, Health & Fitness, and Summer Programs to support children and youth from K - 12 and throughout their post-secondary schooling. Through Community Engagement programs we empower parents, students, and neighbors to become active supporters through volunteering, fundraising, and community events.

FPR initially began serving families in the Nottingham Park Community of Spring Branch ISD. Nestled here are over 3,000 apartment and condos, of which 85% of the families qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch and 50% are single parent households. Over the years our community has also become home to families seeking refuge from natural disaster, violence, and poverty. 53% of our families speak a second language at home. Many families struggle with stress as their resources are stretched. Many have financial concerns, unable to know for certain if they will be able to pay for rent, bills, or food each month. Some also feel stress around time, safety, relationships, transportation, employment, and communication; all resources that help individuals and families to thrive. These challenges shape the environment where children live and these stresses can accumulate to negatively impact the cognitive, physical, emotional, and social development of children. Children too often believe their identity is embedded in what they have, or do not have, what they can, or cannot, do, allowing their circumstances to define them. When a child's circumstances cannot provide all the resources needed for healthy development, they begin to give up and believe they are not worthy. However, when a child is a part of team, when they learn to sew a pillow, and when they have consistent caring adults, and friends in their lives, they are transformed. Our programs are an intentional response to the questions we often hear in our community: Am I loved? How can it get better? Does anyone care? What is my purpose? Can I do it?

In order to flourish in the midst of challenging circumstances children need resources and opportunities that lead to a positive change in their circumstances. FamilyPoint's programs are avenues for children and youth to experience success and build healthy relationships that tell them they are loved. Our programs allows us to welcome each child, exactly as they are, and walk with them developmentally through challenging circumstances and into new opportunities, shaping them into flourishing adults who break cycles of poverty, build healthy relationships, create abundant communities, and positively shape their world.

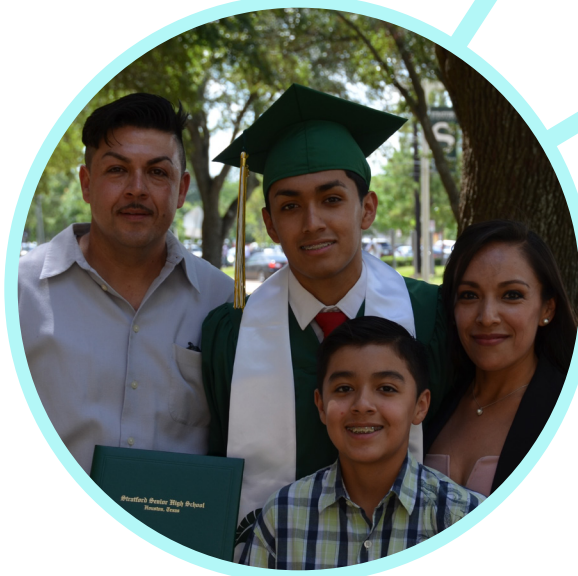

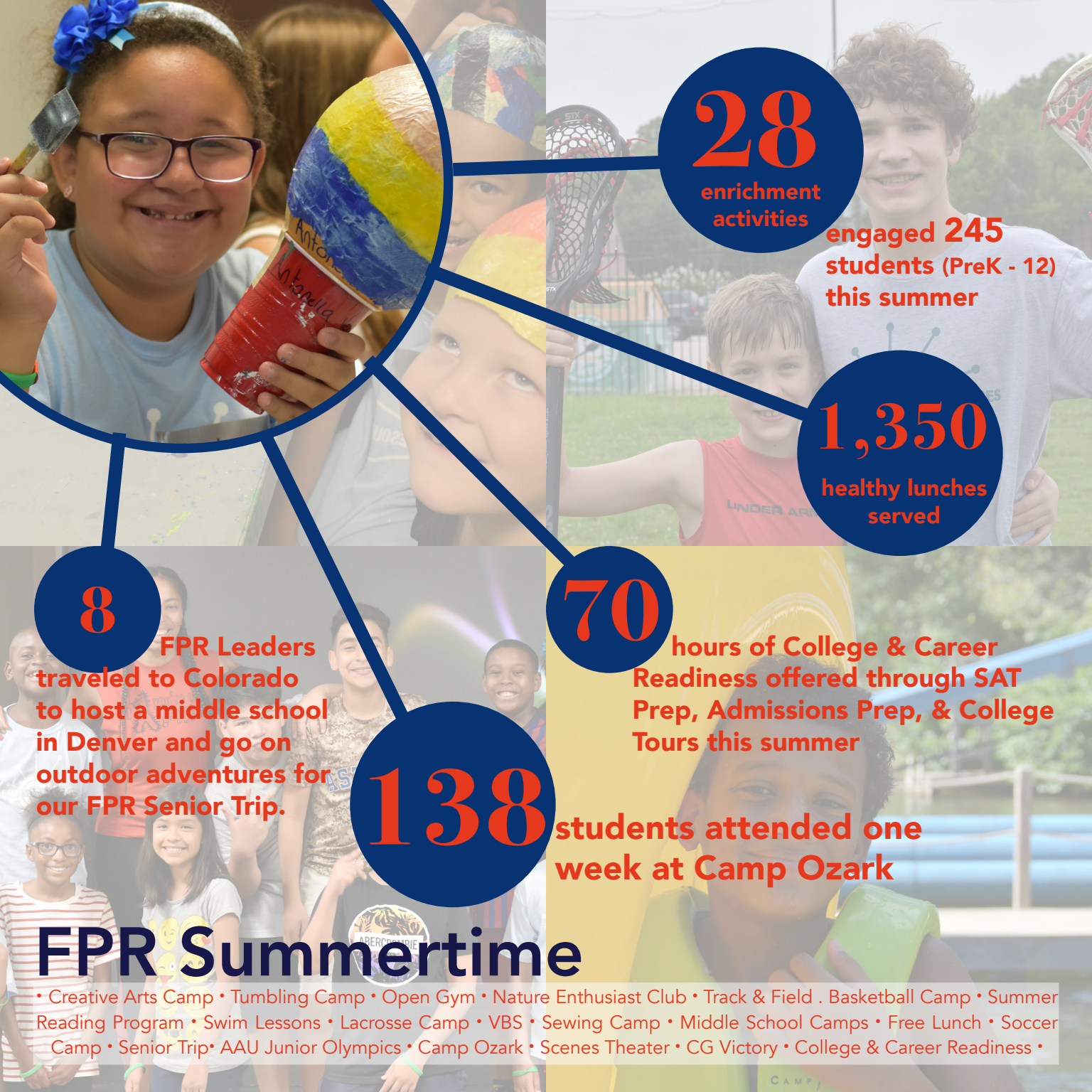

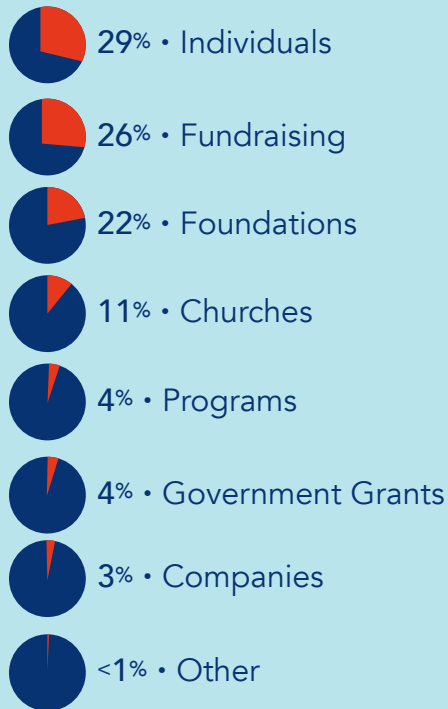
FPR Fiscal Year: 1/1/2018 - 12/31/2018



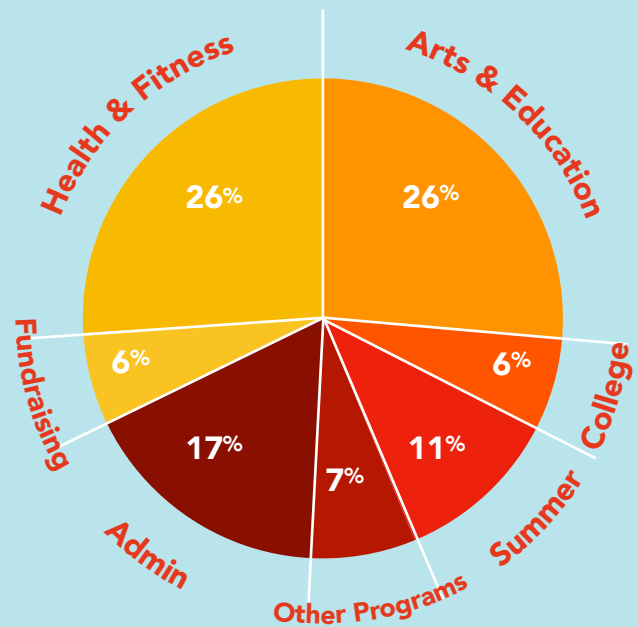
