MEETING NEEDS

Every child is purposefully and uniquely created for this world. They are also handed a set of circumstances outside of their control which shape them. Toxic stresses caused by economic insecurities, broken relationships, language barriers, and hunger can negatively impact a child's mental, physical, and social development. 4 out of every 10 children who live within 5 miles of FPR are considered economically disadvantaged.

BUILDING HOPE

When a child is provided enriching opportunities and consistent supportive relationships with caring adults and peers, the negative impacts of toxic stress decline and make room for hope. FamilyPoint identifies and works with the community to remove obstacles standing between a child and an opportunity. Our programs are designed to empower and equip children and families to break cycles of poverty.

TRANSFORMING LIVES

Since 2019, FamilyPoint has provided \$92,000 for university, college, or trade school scholarships. 5 FPR Alumni have graduated from college and 100% of our College Readiness participants are attending a 2 or 4 year college. After school children from 6 to 18 years old are receiving homework help, access to extra curriculars and sports, and supportive relationships- transforming their lives and their futures.

2021 FPR VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARD

2021 ROBERTA KEYS TORN SERVICE & LEADERSHIP AWARD

This award honors the FamilyPoint student that best exemplifies the heart of a servant and possesses exceptional leadership qualities. The award was inspired by the life of Roberta Keys Torn, a remarkable servant leader who always, "tried to live out God's purpose for her life" through serving others. Award recipients receive the opportunity to attend Camp Ozark, National Student Leadership Conference, and an SAT Prep Course.

274 individuals participated in **1** or more sports through FPR.

24 competed in AAU Track & Field Junior Olympics with **8** winning All-American.

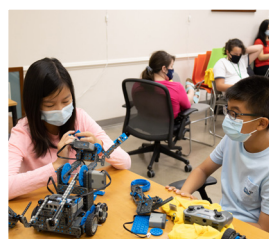
FPR provided **26 SUMMER CAMPS**

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

FPR FINANCIALS

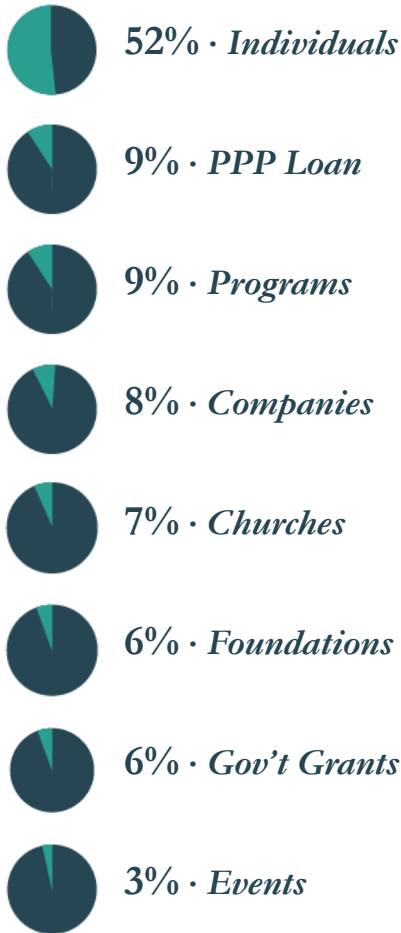
FPR Fiscal Year: 1/1/2020 - 12/31-2020

Our 2020 budget was \$528,400; however, due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic our programs were limited and we significantly cut expenses. We continued to provide support to our families with grocery gift cards and modified in-person programs to support the mental, physical, and social growth of children.

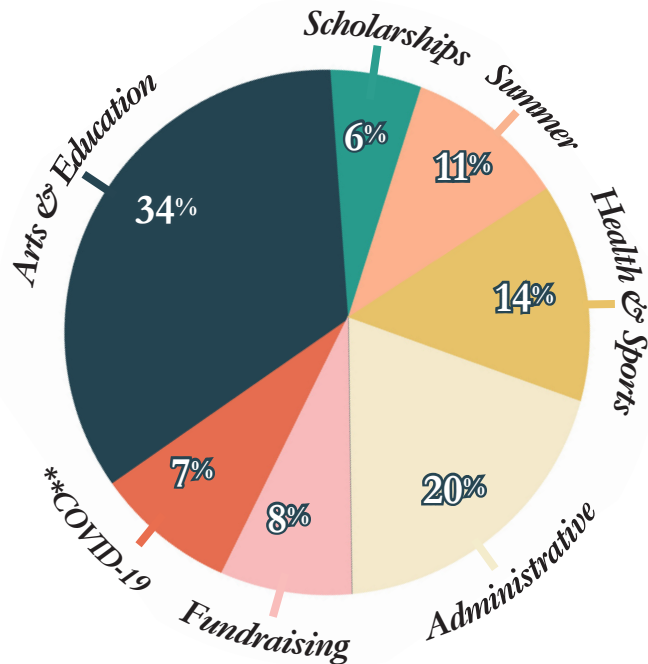

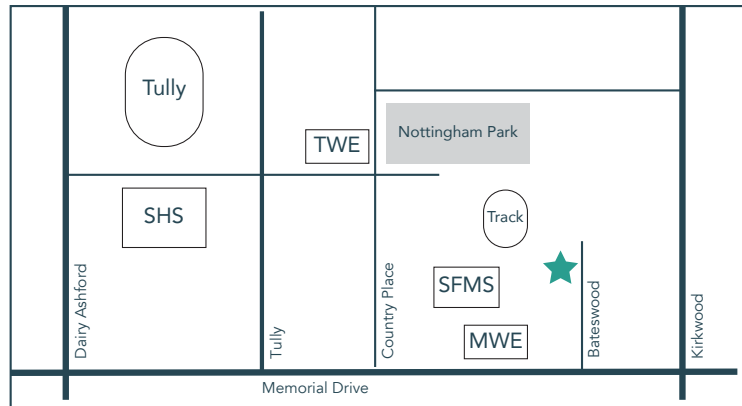
