Meeting Needs

Every child is purposefully and uniquely created for this world. They are also handed a set of circumstances outside of their control which shape them. Toxic stresses caused by economic insecurities, broken relationships, language barriers, and hunger can negatively impact a child's mental, physical, and social development. 4 out of every 10 children that live within 5 miles of FPR are considered economically disadvantaged.

Building Hope (

When a child has access to enriching opportunities and consistent supportive relationships with caring adults and peers, the negative impacts of toxic stress decline and make room for hope. FPR identifies and works with the community to remove obstacles standing between a child and an opportunity. Our programs are designed to empower and equip children and families to flourish.

Transforming Lives

Through FPR, children from 5 to 18 years old are receiving homework help, access to extra curriculars and sports, career readiness, and supportive relationships- transforming their lives and their futures. Our programs allow us to welcome each child, exactly as they are, and walk with them developmentally through challenging circumstances to new opportunities, shaping them into flourishing adults who break cycles of poverty, build healthy relationships, create abundant communities, and positively shape their world.





This award recognizes the volunteer who leaves a legacy in our community. It is someone who dedicates their time and talents to giving back in ways that create new opportunities, support others, and build engaging leaders.

JACOB MOYER, the 2022 Volunteer of the Year Recipient, is a man who embodies generosity. He began in FPR programs playing sports as a participant, then as a high school junior began volunteering as a basketball coach. Throughout high school, college, and now as a young professional he continually shows up as a coach, as a mentor, and as a leader. He makes it possible for boys in our community to be a part of a team, learn skills, and grow into young men of character. FPR has changed Jacob's life, and he is giving back to change the lives of others.











ROBERTA KEYS TORN SERVICE & LEADERSHIP AWARD

This award honors the FamilyPoint participant that best exemplifies the heart of a servant and possesses exceptional leadership qualities. The award was inspired by the life of Roberta Keys Torn, a remarkable servant leader who always, "tried to live out God's purpose for her life" through serving others. Award recipients receive the opportunity to attend Camp Ozark, National Student Leadership Conference, and an SAT Prep Course.

CITLALI VEGA, this year's Roberta Keys Torn Service & Leadership Recipient, is a Junior at Stratford High School. She is a driven young woman who consistently shows up with a positive attitude. On top of juggling classes and extracurriculars, she volunteered 91 hours at FPR in 2021-2022. Her heart for God emboldens her to share wisdom, patience, and time with others, teaching them that they are loved.





In 2008, we started Homework Help at Meadow Wood ES with 20 students in 4th-5th grade. Now 🥁

- 73 Students (K -12) a day received homework help
- 5th Graders received tutorials at the Enrichery



In 2010, we expanded our Summer Camps to include sports, reading, and creative arts for elementary students. Now 🥁

- 327 Summer Participants (PreK - 12)
- 40 Summer Enrichment Camps
- 1,200 Meals served
- 500+ Hours of Enrichment

In 2011, Blue Willow Bookshop partnered with us to create a library. A year later we remodeled our space to accomodate our growing programs and began offering art after school. Now 🥪

- 100 students attend daily
- 6,000+ books, computers & games
- Healthy snacks & meals provided



In 2022, we remembered our ideas from years ago. We reflected on all the volunteers, donors, and new staff who joined us to make these ideas become a reality. We packed up our Seniors and hugged them goodbye as they left for college. We opened our arms to welcome new, younger participants. Since 2019, FamilyPoint has awarded \$147,000 for university, college, or trade school scholarships to 31 deserving participants. In 2021, we hired 2 FPR Alumni to join as full time staff. We served 647 participants with the help of 242 volunteers.

In 2018, FPR celebrated our first college graduates. Chick-fil-A Dairy Ashford nominated us for the True Inpsiration Award and with the most community votes in our region we won. That \$75,000 grant allowed us to create the FPR Scholarship Fund and we provided 4 scholarships. Now 🥪




